## How much is it?

Go to <https://booking.soulsurvivor.com/> and your details and create an account and then add to Church on the Heath booking ref B2K18-109642: Week B.

You can keep logging in and adding more people as many times as you like, right up until the week of the event. Young people can also log in with their own account, pay for themselves and join our group. They will be asked the email address of the person whose group they are joining, which is [youth@churchontheheath.org.uk](mailto:youth@churchontheheath.org.uk). You'll be able to view all the people who have joined your group by clicking on the drop down arrow at the top right hand corner of the booking screen (next to where it says hello), clicking on 'My Account', 'Events Teams' and then 'Groups I Lead'.

## Important things to know

- When you arrive you will be able to buy a programme telling you about the venues, and everything that is going on during the week for £3 or download a free app. Search for Soul Survivor in the app store and once you've downloaded the app pick the programme week B.
- There are no cash machines on site – all venues are free to get into, but you may want some money for food from our food vans, cakes/drinks/snacks in the café and buying resources from the Toolshed.
- A dedicated phone charging station will be available during the afternoons and evenings to make sure you keep in contact with the outside world. You can find it by looking for the little battery logo on the map.
- There is WIFI available for free, but this is limited and may be a little slow at times.
- As valuables can't be secured in tents, we suggest you leave them at home.
- Please don't bring anything dangerous (such as knives, BB guns, or fireworks) or any alcohol or illegal drugs. If we find you with them they will be confiscated and you will be asked to leave the event.

## Kit List:

- Tent (with poles and pegs) or arrange to share with your friends (in single sex tents),
- Air camping bed or roll mat
- Sleeping bag
- Pillow and pillowcase
- Plate, bowl and cutlery for meal times
- Torch (with spare batteries)
- Bible and notebook
- Toiletries & towel
- Warm clothes – enough for a week
- Underwear and socks – enough for a week
- Two pairs of shoes/trainer (in case one gets wet/muddy)
- Waterproof jacket
- Wellies and thick socks
- Sunscreen and sunhat
- Pocket money as there are stalls and cafes. No more than £15. You will be responsible for your own money at all times.
- Fancy dress costume for the last night! This year's theme is Noah's Ark. Feel free to be as creative as you like, but it's not compulsory to dress up.

## Church on the Heath Contract for Soul Survivor Event

1. Be street –wise – don't go off with strangers; don't arrange to meet with anyone in dark corners of the site. Stay in groups of two or three.
2. At night make sure you are back at camp at 11, in your own tent by 11:30pm and quiet by midnight (sleep walking is no excuse!)
3. No birthday cakes with candles, no lighters, or any other naked flames. Food will be cooked by the leaders. If would like a hot drink, please ask a leader to assist you. You do not need your own gas stove.
4. Respect the property and building of the site.
5. Remember to drink lots of water, even if it's raining, but especially if it's sunny. Should the sun decide to grace us with its presence, please use sunscreen.
6. Make sure a leader from our group knows where you are at all times.
7. Strictly no drugs, intoxicating agents (such as 'legal highs') or drug paraphernalia are allowed on site, except when medically prescribed. Anyone found in possession of drugs or suspected to be under the influence of drugs will be evicted from the site and denied further entry to the event. Any such incidents will be reported to the Site Management Team. To take further if they see appropriate.
8. Event wristbands must be worn at all times. They are the only way to get into venues. There is a charge of £25 to replace lost ones.
9. Smoking is not permitted inside any of the buildings, marquees or individual tents and caravans.
10. Ball games are to be finished by 10pm – even if the outcome is nil-nil.
11. Roller blading, skateboarding or cycling can only occur in the dark if you have the appropriate lighting.
12. However hot it gets, and tempting it seems, there is to be no swimming in the lake
